3 Chairman's Report.

This report covers the last two years, as due to the lockdown last year we weren't able to hold the Annual meeting and I hope it doesn't sound too negative.

Year 2019/2020 remedial work was carried out on the hall roof, namely gutters cleared, and some of the roof was cleared of moss and a leak repaired. We also managed to obtain the services of a Locksmith and he has provided us with a safe key.

A local resident Mr Sawyer kindly had painted a Fire Assembly point in the carpark.

Unfortunately, the Seniors Party had to be cancelled, but as soon as we were able to access the money collected in, we refunded all the money.

Year 2020/2021 the roof of the Parish Hall has had all the moss removed, this should help to prevent any further damage.

At the beginning of 2020 the bench outside the Spar Shop was knocked over by a lorry. Mr Mark Paddison had arranged for the bench to be repaired and this was finally replaced at the end of April 2021.

We have been able to start the re-decoration of the hall, hall has been done, and other areas including the Prince George Suite are due to be completed before we open up again, in June 2021.

We have experienced many problems with Lloyds Bank and altering the bank mandate, so we can use internet banking again. Hopefully this is all a thing of the past and it should be plain sailing from now on. They have also compensated the Parish Council in a monetary form.

Other than that I would like to think that we can start to increase the usage of the hall and turning the Parish Hall back into the vibrant centre of the village.
